Culvert Replacements on US 40 and State Route 202 in Bethel Township – ADDITIONAL INFO

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) proposes to replace three existing culverts in Bethel Township, Miami County. The project is necessary to address deterioration of the culverts. Construction is expected to be undertaken in Summer 2026. At each location, construction could require up to one month. The affected roadways will be closed at the culverts during construction; signed detours will be provided. Minor temporary and/or permanent acquisition may be needed for construction and future maintenance.

As you are a nearby property owner/occupant (or other interested party), we wish to inform you regarding this project. We welcome your questions and comments. Issues you may wish to comment on include, but are not limited to, the effect of the project on local residents, air quality, the local economy, floodplains and historic or cultural resources. Comments are requested by June 15, 2024, to ensure your comments may be considered in the project development.

Please be aware that, at this stage in project development, it will not be possible to provide you with specific information regarding potential real estate acquisition. If right-of-way acquisition is necessary from your property, personnel with the District 7 Real Estate office will contact you directly at a later date, to discuss the right-of-way needs, the acquisition process, and your rights under that process.

Outside Law Firm Usage Guidelines for Bethel Township Trustees and Fiscal Officer – OPTIONS

If a trustee or the Fiscal Officer determines it is beneficial to employ the services of the outside legal firm that the township has agreed to use, the following steps must be followed:

- 1. Any trustee or the fiscal officer is authorized to request a legal opinion from the law firm.
- 2. Such requests must be submitted to the law firm in writing.
- 3. Upon making a request for legal services, the requesting party must promptly inform the other trustees and the fiscal officer.
- 4. The other trustees and the fiscal officer must be provided with the exact content of the request as it was submitted.
- 5. The law firm's response to the requestor must also be copied to the other trustees and the fiscal officer.

OR

- 1. Before making a request for a legal opinion from the law firm, the request must be discussed in an executive session at a workshop or regular meeting, with all three trustees and fiscal officer present.
- 2. After discussion, the trustee or fiscal officer can request a legal opinion from the law firm
- 3. Such requests must be submitted to the law firm in writing.
- 4. Upon making a request for legal services, the requesting party must promptly inform the other trustees and the fiscal officer.
- 5. The other trustees and the fiscal officer must be provided with the exact content of the request as it was submitted.
- 6. The law firm's response to the requestor must also be copied to the other trustees and the fiscal officer.
