Phoneton Sewer Project: Message from Sheriff Cox



During the first week of July, Miami County Sheriff Charles Cox was alerted to a scam concerning driveway repair in the Phoneton Sewer Project area. Sheriff Cox issued the following PRESS RELEASE:

The Miami County Sheriff's Office would like to alert Bethel Township residents of a scam involving driveway repair. A local contractor has been contacting residents in Bethel who had their driveways damaged during the installation of the sanitary line in the SR 202/Phoneton area. The contractor offers to repair the damage and bills the resident telling the resident they can take the receipt to the county for reimbursement. The Sheriff's Office has contacted the local contractor and warned them that should any more complaints be received, a fraud complaint would be initiated.

Fire Department Receives FEMA Firefighter Grant



In mid-March, the Board of Trustees was notified by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) that the Bethel Township Fire Department had been awarded a 2011 FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) in the amount of \$111,000.00 for the purchase of new equipment and training. The grant requires 5% matching funds by the Township, which amounts to \$5,500.00.

The grant requested assistance in purchasing:

- 800Mhz radios for all eight (8) Department vehicles and an additional 14 portable radios for on scene communication at a total cost of 65,600.00. These new radios will allow for better communication with the Miami County 911 Center in Troy, on scene communication, as well as communication when providing or receiving mutual aid from surrounding communities.
- \$15,000.00 for the purchase of 10 complete sets of new protective equipment for firefighters. Funds will be used to buy helmets, boots, and protective jackets and pants.

School Levies on the August 7, 2012 Ballot

On Tuesday, August 7th, Bethel Local Schools will have two levies on the ballot. The first is a 2 mil levy for Permanent Improvements. This levy is a renewal, thus no new taxes. The second levy is a 7 mil levy for Operating Expenses. This levy is a replacement of an existing 7 mil levy in order to adjust for inflation and reduced funding from the state. For a \$100,000 home, it will result in an increase of \$4.44 per month, should the levy pass. Larry Smith, superintendent of Bethel Local Schools explained "The administration has actively and successfully worked to reduce costs over the past few years. We eliminated eleven staff positions, increased the ac-

tivity fee for students and many other measures. However, every school district in Ohio has seen significant cuts to funding from the state and at the same time, everyone's costs for fuel, healthcare, light bulbs and even paper continue to rise".

Zoning Summer Reminders

Now that all the snow is gone and rains are slowing down, it's time to enjoy the summer. Here are some reminders from the Planning & Zoning Department:

- Grass and weeds. Properties need to be free of overgrown grasses and weeds. Grass and weeds that exceed 12 inches in height should be reported to the Planning and Zoning Department so that a process can be started to have the grass cut by the owner or ultimately by a pre-determined contractor of the township.
- Junk cars: Bethel Township allows one vehicle that is not operating, not licensed or apparently inoperable. More than one vehicle constitutes a violation of the Bethel Township Zoning Resolution.
- Swimming pools: All swimming pools (including above ground and temporary pools that have a depth greater than twenty four (24) inches) are required to have a fence or barrier of at least four (4) feet around the entire pool area. If the pool wall is four (4) feet or greater, the pool wall may count as a barrier. Any steps or decks leading to an above ground pool must either be retracting or have a gate of at least 4 feet.

The Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) met in regular for the months of April and June to hear the following cases:

<u>V-03-12:</u> A request from Jessie & Irene Centers, 2976 US Route 40, Tipp City, OH, 45371. The applicant requests a variance under Article 5.05 of the Bethel Township Zoning Resolution to allow for the construction of a 6'x25' addition to a single family residence on property located in a Residential (R-1A) zoning district. **Approved**

<u>V-04-12:</u> A request from Paul Galloway, 8445 Heilman Dr., New Carlisle, OH, 45344. The applicant requests a variance under Article 5.05 of the Bethel Township Zoning Resolution to reduce the side yard setback from the required fifteen feet (15') to approximately nine feet (9') on a property located in a General Agricultural (A-2) zoning district. **Pending**

<u>V-05-12:</u> A request from John Cooley, 7580 State Route 571, New Carlisle, OH, 45344. The applicant requests a variance under Article 5.05 of the Bethel Township Zoning Resolution to increase the maximum size of permitted accessory structure from the required twenty four hundred (2400) square feet to approximately thirty four hundred and forty (3440) square feet located in a Domestic Agricultural (A-1) zoning district. **Pending**

The Board of Trustees had ten (10) items on their agenda. The Trustees authorized the amending of the Brandt Sanitary Sewer Agreement with the Miami County Commissioners. The Board also authorized the payment of the Township's Ohio Bureau of Workers Compensation premium and selected Careworks of Ohio to serve as the Township's managed care organization for worker's compensation claims for the next year. Additionally, the Board declared four (4) properties to be tall grass nuisances.

Fire Department Receives FEMA Firefighter Grant

The grant also requested funding of additional training for Department members that includes:

- 25 State of Ohio Fire Certification in either Level I or Level II at a cost of \$20,000.00.
- State of Ohio Level I, II, III and/or IV Certification for all eleven officers within the Department at a cost of \$10,400.00.

Assistant Fire Chief Josh Schiebrel updated the Trustees recently on the status of the grant saying, "We are in the process of purchasing and programing the new radios, meeting with protective gear manufacturers to select the protective gear that best meets the Department needs, as well as scheduling Department members for classes this summer and fall at this time."

Currently, Township staff is preparing a 2012 FEMA AFG application for the purchase of new heart monitors/ defibrillators and additional EMS training. The Department should know by early 2013 if they have received this grant.
