WHEREAS, LT. KYER'S SERVES AS THE ON DUTY LIEUTENANT FOR HIS ASSIGNED CREW NIGHT OF SATURDAY NIGHT, AND

WHEREAS, IT IS THE DESIRE OF THE TOWNSHIP TO HAVE AN IN HOUSE OFFICER FOR EACH CREW NIGHT, AND

RE: Seasonal Road Department Hires

On your agenda tonight is the hiring of Ben Allen and Kurtis Green to the two (2) seasonal Road Department positions. These appointments are through October 1, 2012 and the Resolution is written so that it can be extended if the Board deems it necessary.

Both gentlemen have worked for us in the past as fill in labor for the Road Department. And, both have worked for us for three (3) years or more as members of the Fire Department and will be utilized for additional responses during their working hours.

Based on 16 weeks of work for both positions, these are the base numbers for this year;

Based on these numbers, we would save approximately \$38,217.18 over last year's base personnel cost (last year's costs do not include overtime).

RESOLUTION 12-06-084

A RESOLUTION DISPOSING OF SURPLUS PROPERTY FROM THE BETHEL TOWNSHIP FIRE DEPARTMENT AND AUTHORIZING THE DONATION OF SURPLUS PROPERTY TO AN ELIGIBLE NON PROFIT ORGANIZATION ACCORDING TO SECTION 505.10 OF THE OHIO REVISED CODE.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") has determined that they are the owner of property that is no longer of value and service to Bethel Township; and

WHEREAS, the Board is empowered by Section 505.10 (A)(2) (b) to donate property to an eligible non profit, with proper advertisement or public notification ; and

WHEREAS, said items consist of firefighting gear utilized by the Bethel Township Fire Department, and

WHEREAS, said gear is either beyond repair or does not comply with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards for firefighter protection based on years of service, and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to donate the surplus property listed in Exhibit A to a nonprofit organization that shall be determined at a later date. Any such organization shall be identified as exempt from federal income taxation pursuant to 26 U.S.C. 501 (a) and (c)(3) and shall submit a written notice to the board or its representative. This written notice shall include evidence of their tax status; a description of the organization's primary purpose; a description of the type or types of property the organization needs; and the name, address, and telephone number of a person designated by the organization's governing board to receive donated property and to serve as its agent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Bethel Township, Miami County, Ohio by authority of Chapter 504 and Section 505.10 of the Ohio Revised Code, as follows:

SECTION 1: The Board determines that the surplus property listed on Exhibit A is no longer of value and service to Bethel Township Fire Department; and,

SECTION 2: That Section 505.10 of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes the donation of surplus property to an eligible nonprofit, with proper advertisement or publication; and

SECTION 3: That the Township Administrator or designee shall proceed to donate property in accordance with ORC 505.10(A)(2)(b); and,

SECTION 4: That this Board hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and of its Committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code; further

SECTION 5: This Resolution shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.
